How is Our School Development Plan Used?

- Guides ongoing assessment and review of goals and actions.
- Our school development plan is the driver for closing learning gaps and informs:
 - Instructional strategies
 - Professional learning
 - School structures and processes for learning
 - Resources to improve student learning
 - Data-informed decision making





School Development Plan – School Goal

Student achievement in literacy will improve





School Development Plan – Outcome

 Student achievement in comprehending and applying vocabulary will improve through disciplinary literacy.







School Development Plan – Outcome Measures

- Pre-assessment and Post-assessment collection in each PLC
- MIPI data (math assessment) collected at beginning and end of school year
- CORE vocabulary data collected at beginning and end of school year







School Development Plan – Data for Monitoring Progress

- Teacher Perception Data on use of diagnostic writing and teaching writing strategies (ELA)
- Teacher Perception Data on student understanding and application of disciplinespecific vocabulary in problem-solving (Math)
- Teacher feedback on PLC work
- Access to Continuum of Supports through classroom or Resource





- Learning Excellence Actions
 - Utilize high-impact strategies to engage students in vocabulary and word learning across all disciplines
 - Develop mathematical language by modelling and explicit instruction
 - Use of frayer models
 - Provide mentor texts that utilize disciplinary vocabulary





- Well-Being Actions
 - Provide repeated opportunities for learners to practice and consolidate literacy skills
 - Create learning spaces that provide learners with a safe and respectful environment
 - Activate students as owners of their learning by engaging learners in self-assessment and/or reflection
 - Provide feedback that moves learners forward





- Truth & Reconciliation, Diversity and Inclusion
 - Use scaffolding strategies to support multilingual learners
 - Empower students to have voice in their learning
 - Focus on vocabulary in student first languages through EAL classes
 - Provide multiple entry points

School Development Plan – Outcome

 Students will develop trusting relationships within the school community.







School Development Plan – Outcome Measures

- Student perceptions on in-school belonging survey
 Grades 6-9
- Student responses on student-to-student mapping – Grades 6-9
- Student responses on CBE student survey question "I feel included and I feel welcomed at school."
- Student responses to AEA Survey question "At school I feel like I belong."
- Principal listens to student survey (student council)
- Teacher perceptions homeroom







School Development Plan – Data for Monitoring Progress

- Teacher feedback (CTM, PLC)
- Comparative Data on in-school belonging surveys
- Comparative Data on student-to-student mapping
- Student attendance on whole school events
- Overall student attendance and SLT supports





- Learning Excellence Actions
 - Utilize data to direct teaching practices to support student belonging
 - Work with students to create structures to support connectedness
 - Explicit instruction of Social Emotional Competenccies
 - Middle Years Professional Learning





- Well-Being Actions
 - Promote, encourage and support students to engage in extra-curricular or team building events
 - Student and teacher well-being action team developing and implement school wide initiatives to encourage belonging and connectedness
 - Assess current school structures and lok for opportunities to create time and space for students to interact





- Truth & Reconciliation, Diversity and Inclusion
 - Whole school planning to create programs that are based on student voice and choice
 - Create safe and caring classroom spaces that are culturally responsive
 - Be intentional in efforts to establish positive and trusting relationships

Our School Budget

- Our school received \$4,962,786 in 2024-25 to provide a quality education to our students and meet the goals in our school development plan (SDP).
- At least 75 per cent of budgeted funds covers staffing and the remaining portion covers instructional and operational supplies.


